- \$225.00 deposit required to process registration. **Balance due in full by February 15, 2009.**
- If we fill up, we'll notify you and be happy to put your name on a first-come, first-served waiting list and offer you a full refund if we are unable to find a place for you. In that case, we'll guarantee your place at our next camp if you'd like us to keep your deposit on file.
- Cancellation fees: \$50.00 before February 15, 2009; \$200.00 from February 15 to March 31, 2009; \$300 from April 1 to April 16, 2009; no refunds thereafter.
- A limited number of full and part-time scholarships are available. Please contact our office for more information.
